Spring Meeting of Members

2 Jun, 2018 1310 hrs. 71, Saddle Rock Road, Stamford, Conn.

Minutes

- 1. Acting Secretary Ove Haxthausen confirmed that a quorum was present
- 2. A motion to waive the reading of the minutes of the December 2017 Annual Meeting was made, seconded, and agreed to. The minutes were approved with no changes.
- 3. Reports of officers
 - a. Post Captain Ernie Godshalk declared to Station in good shape financially and otherwise, with active Home Clubs which the Post Captain has had ongoing contact with, including meetings and dinners with flag officers from KNS, KDY and KSSS. Four, possibly five sailors will participate in the Junior Exchange this year, four from Scandinavia and one from the US.
 - b. Fleet Captain David Tunick indicated strong interest in the 2019 Stockholm Archipelago Cruise. Nearly 350 have indicated interest and 135 have signed up and paid the deposit, representing approximately 30 boats. He envisions 50-60 boats divided into three divisions. The opening dinner will be held in the Vasa Museum. A reception at the US Ambassador's Residence is in the works, but a US Ambassador has not yet been appointed. The closing dinner will be at KSSS' Sandhamn. The 2022 cruise will be in Norway starting in Bergen and heading South. The previous cruise in Norway also started in Bergen but headed North to Sognefjorden.
 - c. Acting Secretary Ove Haxthausen provided an update on the membership and read a list of members and former members recently deceased: Jim Bishop, Ruth Clark, Bjorn Johnson, Buck Margold, Skip Sheldon, and Dan Walker. They will be formally remembered in December.
 - d. Treasurer Jennifer Bowden presented her report (attached) and encouraged members to consider a donation to TAR in anticipation of the 2020 event which will be organized by the Station. A comment was made about the importance of TAR and the Five Club Regatta for the Station because of the visibility that these events provide with the Home Clubs
- 4. Reports of committees
 - a. Membership Chairman presented a list of candidates for election to membership. The list is attached.
 - b. In the absence of TAR Chairman Allan Heyward, the Post Captain led a

- discussion about TAR, requesting members to indicate their interest in sailing for the Station at the end of August in Denmark.
- c. The Post Captain also requested candidates for the Five Club Regatta, sailors in the 15-18 years age range. The Post Captain referred to his previous statements (see 3.a above) regarding the Junior Exchange.
- d. Home Club representatives
 - i. Viveka Kjellgren provided an update on the key activities at GKSS including a full schedule of regattas
 - ii. Peter Vranum described a full Summer schedule of racing and cruising events at KDY and mentioned the recent passing of HRH Prince Henrik of Denmark who was Honorary Commodore of KDY from 1972 to 2016 and was a big supporter of the club.
 - iii. In her absence, Angelica Barrows had sent a report about KNS' activities, see attached.
 - iv. In his absence, Henrik Roos had sent a report about NJK's activities, see attached. Lars Colliander provided some further updates, including about the proposed club house move, which is still up in the air.
 - v. Carolina Säve provided an overview of KSSS' activities, including a new Commodore, a full schedule of racing events, two gold medals in 470s.
 - vi. Fleet Captain David Tunick commented that in twenty years, the relationship with the Home Clubs had never been stronger. He encouraged the membership to be grateful to the Post Captain for that.
- e. The Fleet Captain provided an update on the Safety-at-Sea seminar for cruising couples held at Stamford Yacht Club on May 20. He expressed his gratitude to Secretary Hiro Nakajima for his help organizing it. Two other clubs were involved: The New York Yacht Club and the Cruising Club of America. 50-60 students attended. The seminar included classroom sessions in the morning followed by practical sessions on boats in the afternoon. The target audience is cruising couples unlikely to make overnight passages. Larchmont Yacht Club, Noroton Yacht Club and New York Yacht Club (Harbour Court) have all asked to have a similar session next year.
- f. The Fleet Captain referred to his report regarding an update on the 2019 Stockholm cruise (see section 3.b above)
- g. Ove Haxthausen provided an update on the potential participation of Scandinavian twelve metres in the Twelve Metre World Championship in Newport next year, including the participation of a Team Wings delegation in the NYYC Race Week in July this year to test the waters and gain local knowledge. Nick Brown offered his boat Foxtrot for Team Wings to sail in the NYYC Race Week
- h. The Fleet Captain referred to his report regarding an update on the 2022 Stockholm cruise (see section 3.b above)
- i. David Tunick, the Chairman of the Awards Committee indicated that awards would be presented
- j. The Post Captain indicated that the Christmas Dinner Dance would be held on Friday December 7 at the New York Yacht Club in Manhattan as usual

- k. Treasurer Jennifer Bowden indicated that social events will be planned
- l. Station Historian Tom Chadwick presented his report (see attached) together with his resignation
- 5. There was no old business
- 6. New business
 - a. The list of membership candidates presented by the Secretary was elected unanimously by the Governing Board
 - b. The meeting was adjourned at 1401 hrs. The meeting was followed by the traditional clambake

Treasurer's Report

The North American Station: The year ended May 31, 2018 with revenue of \$124,501, expenditures of \$100,945 and net revenue of \$23,566. Our cash accounts hold \$124,409 of which \$38,659 is earmarked for the 2019 Stockholm Archipelago. With revenue and expenditure from both a successful safety seminar and the always popular clambake still outstanding, it is difficult to compare fiscal year 2017 to 2016 in much more detail. The increase in new members, however, provides a welcome increase in revenue and, we hope, greater non-monetary benefits. A statement of activity and statement of financial position for The North American Station are attached. As your new Treasurer is still struggling to fill the large shoes of your former Treasurer and become familiar with the Station's accounting software, you will find both statements are presented on a comparative basis for reference.

The Atlantic Round: The year ended May 31, 2018 with revenue of \$4,331 and expenditures of \$6,898 for a loss of \$2,617. Individual contributions declined from \$7,975 in fiscal year 2016 to \$4,201 in fiscal year 2017. The cash balance also declined to \$66,503 from \$69,120 last fiscal year. While the increase in expenses and decrease in cash is not unexpected due to the triennial cyclical nature of The Atlantic Round's activities, the almost 50% decline in contributions could be considered a source of concern. To continue hosting The Atlantic Round and Five Club Regatta every three years, inflows of approximately \$7,000 per year, on average, are necessary to maintain our reserves. A comparative statement of activity and comparative statement of financial position for The Atlantic Round are attached.

MID YEAR REPORT KNS - 2018

All in all things are very good at KNS – the regular schedule of regattas all season long are in place, finances are good, membership not declining and the facilities maintained.

In addition to all the committee activities, the safety at sea, the sailing school etc KNS does a lot of other things as well - I have decided to point out some of the more random activities of this year in this status.

- Today, Saturday 2 June, starts the biggest regatta-week at KNS. The first part is the regatta "Grundig Sailing Cup" racing J70'sail-league for the first part and from against next weekend the famous regatta "Færderen" that is an overnight race of at least 750 boats out the fjord, around Færder lighthouse and back to the town of Tønsberg on the west-coast. - May 5 cleaning the shore. Just like the rest of the sailing community in Norway and
 in the world, KNS has increased focus on the awful threaths of all the plastic and
 carbage in the sea and shore. KNS both juniors and other members had a full day of
 efford to contribute. This is important work and will probably be held regulary.
